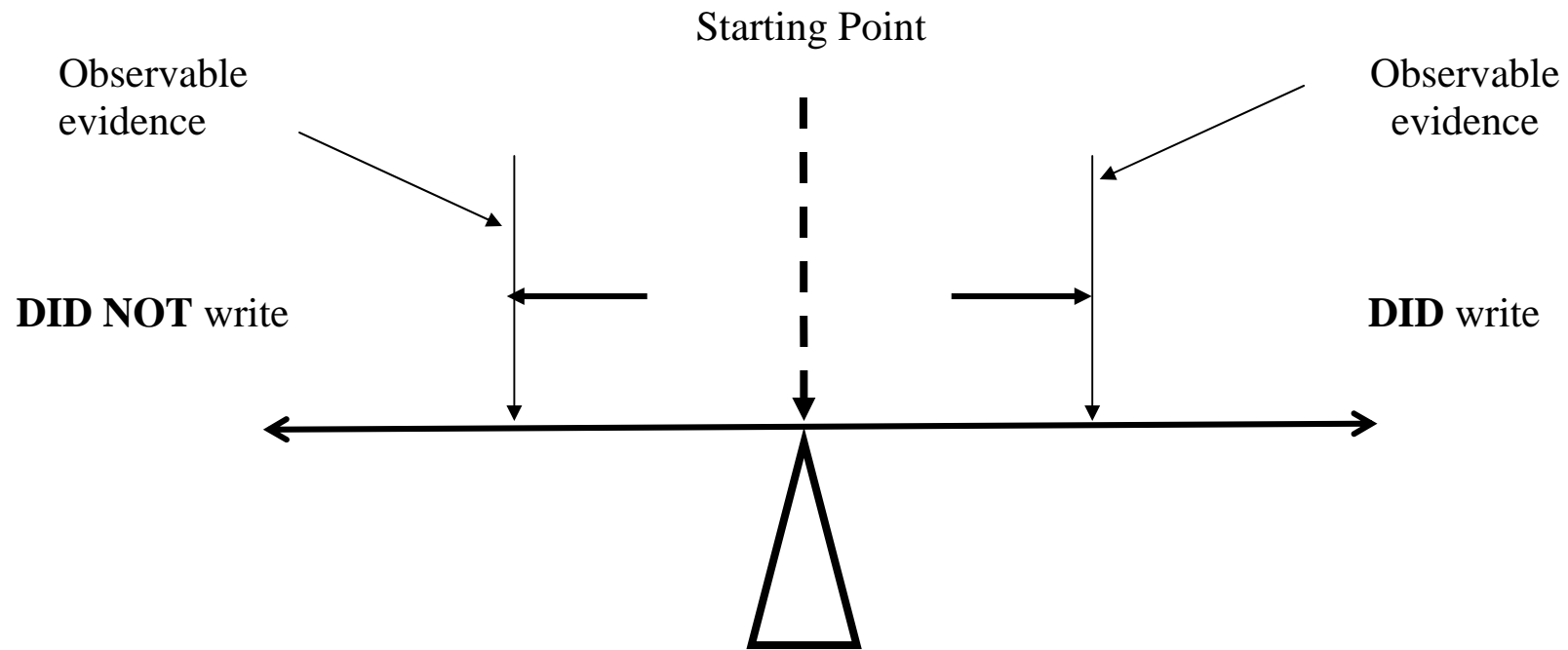


The comparison process is like a seesaw
